Organizations may also need to reskill employees to take on cloud-based roles to manage cloud adoption for the business.

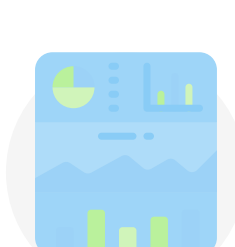
## 4 DATA LITERACY
